## Bob Baron

### Thomas Jefferson and John Adams

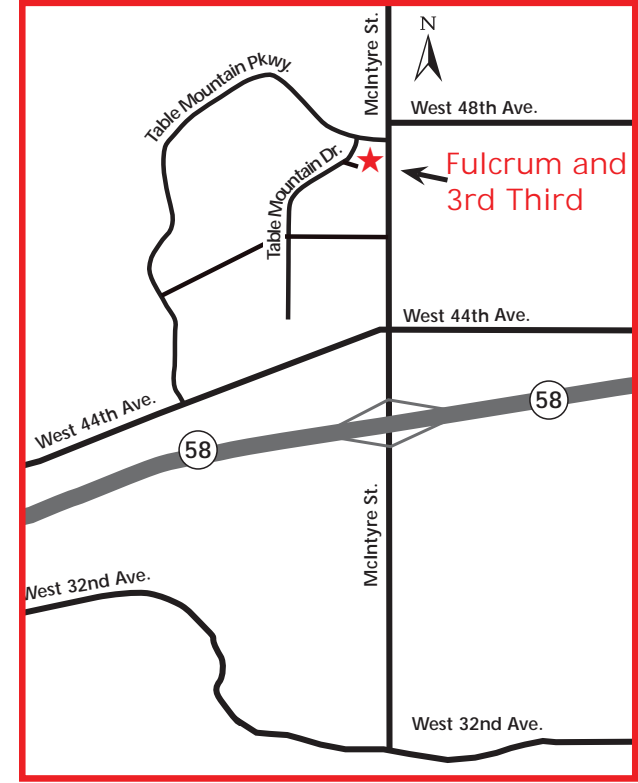
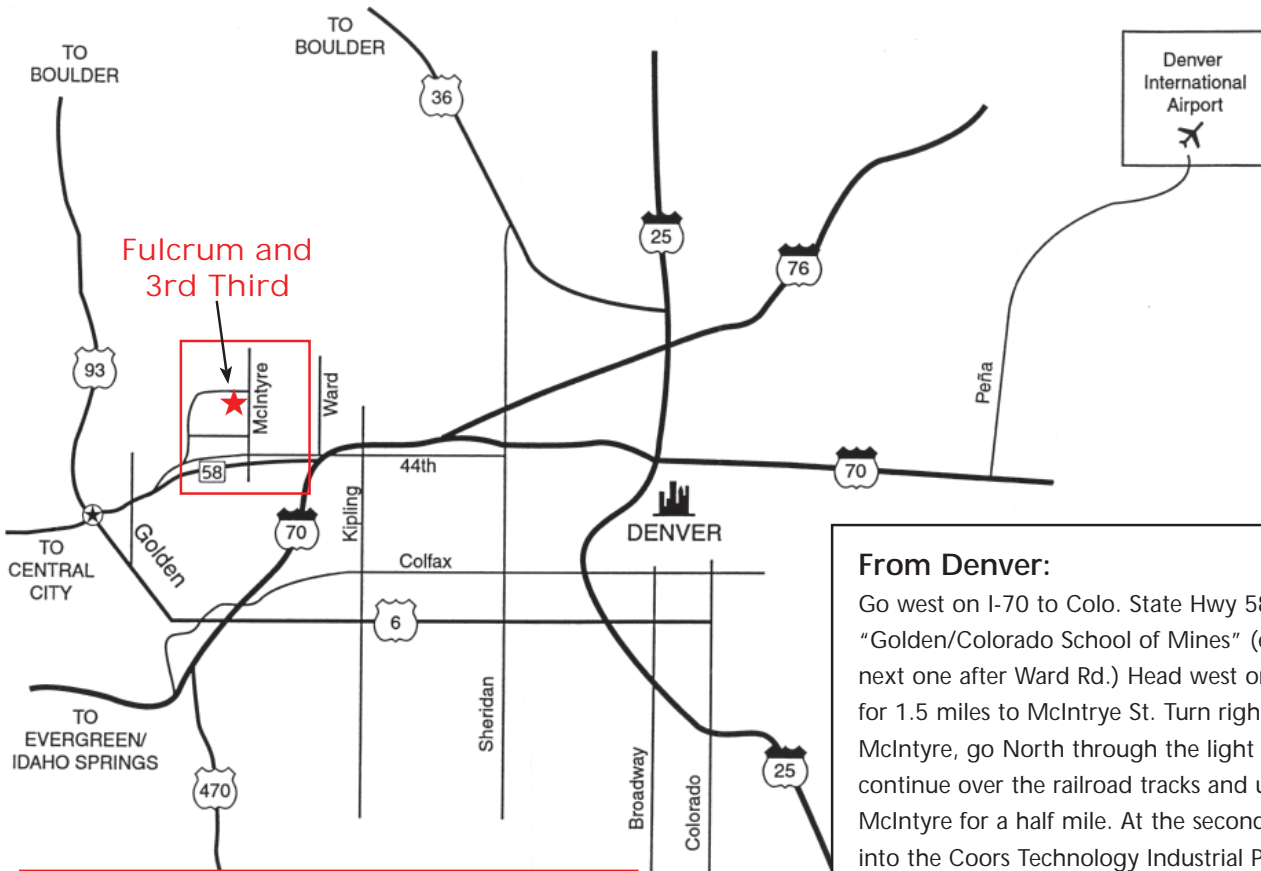
*The odd couple*



Who was John Adams? Who was Thomas Jefferson? Bob will talk about these friends, this odd couple, and their remarkable contributions to our country. Where did they come from, what did they each believe? He'll cover the discoveries of each man, their work together in the fight for our independence, their influence in establishing the U.S. Constitution, as well as a look at the administrations of the 2nd and 3rd presidents of the United States. Most importantly, we'll examine how their friendship ripened during the 18<sup>1/2</sup> years of their retirement.

The letters of John Adams and Thomas Jefferson revealed the two former presidents to be among the most learned men of their day. Avid readers both, each man built an impressive library containing thousands of volumes. Over time Jefferson built three libraries, the second of which served in 1815 as the basis for the Library of Congress, reconstructed after the burning of Washington during the War of 1812. Their reading permeated their thought and their actions, providing an important foundation for their contributions to American governance.

**From Denver:**  
 Go west on I-70 to Colo. State Hwy 58 exit "Golden/Colorado School of Mines" (exit is the next one after Ward Rd.) Head west on Hwy 58 for 1.5 miles to McIntyre St. Turn right onto McIntyre, go North through the light at 44th, continue over the railroad tracks and up McIntyre for a half mile. At the second left turn into the Coors Technology Industrial Park onto Table Mountain Parkway. (There are 3 flags at this entrance). Then take the first left onto Table Mountain Drive. We are the first building on the left, Suite 100.

**From the South and West:**  
 Take C470 North and exit onto I-70 East. Continue on I-70 until State Hwy 58 exit (the one after 32nd and Youngfield exit). The Hwy 58 exit will fly over I-70 and proceed West. The first exit off Hwy 58 will be McIntyre Street. Take McIntyre and travel North. You will cross through the intersection at 44th and continue North over the railroad tracks and go about a half mile. At the second left, turn into the Coors Technology Industrial Park onto Table Mountain Parkway. (There are 3 flags at this entrance). Then take the first left onto Table Mountain Drive. We are the first building on the left, Suite 100.
